# Information Clinics

We feel so blessed to be able to share with those abroad who desire to start a ranch program that is similar to Crystal Peaks. We have done this annually for the last several years through our Information Clinics. Our 2006 event was wonderful beyond words. Because of the increasing popularity of these Clinics, we will be hosting two Information Clinics in 2007. The dates will be **May 23–26** and also **June 6–9**.

All areas pertaining to starting and maintaining a similar ministry are covered during this time. This includes: Basic Natural Horsemanship, Horse Management, Child & Horse Safety, Working with Kids, Volunteer Programming, Fundraising, Obtaining a 501(c)(3) & Business Information. Many of the sessions are lecture/Q&A type format while other sessions will be observing the horse program in action. The cost of the Clinic is \$250 per person, which includes all meals while you are here. If you are interested in attending one of our Clinics, please mail in our Registration Form along with our Release

Forms, which can be found on our website or by contacting our office. Because of the long days and in-depth information, we do ask that the minimum age for participants be 18.

For those who will be flying, there are two airport options. Redmond Municipal Airport is about 30 minutes away, but is quite small. You may find better fares by flying into Portland International Airport and driving the remaining distance of 3 hours (it is a beautiful drive).

# LESSONS *from the Round-pen*

When the weather turns cold and the days get shorter our usually bustling ranch slows down a bit. The laughter and chatter of hundreds of wonderful kids is subsided and our wonderful horses get a well deserved rest. On cold mornings they can be seen gathered together for shared warmth under the trees and wind shelters. When the sun pokes through the clouds they stand lazily soaking up the warmth. After a good nap they play energetically by jumping, bucking and running around chasing one another with a flat horse toy in their mouth. It is good to be a horse at Crystal Peaks!

But it's not all fun and relaxation. This winter we have begun a new form of Equine Training and two days a week have been dedicated to working with all of our horses. Each staff member is assigned two horses, and is learning to train them. Troy and Kim use many combined methods of horsemanship that are primarily influenced by Tom and Bill Dorrance, Buck Branaman, and Clint Surplus. They have spent many hours observing and coaching the Crystal Peaks staff in the round pen and arena. A lifelong partnership is being established between the staff and horses that goes

far beyond a simple encounter between the two.

Instead of merely training our horses, we are working towards establishing three important things: trust, respect and understanding. Before coming to the ranch, many of our horses had been mishandled or even abused in training situations and were understandably cautious. A few, when confined to a round pen, frantically searched for a way of escape. Yet, love always proves what is true. Bit by bit, they began to genuinely show their desire to trust again. We have felt so honored

to stand quietly by, patiently encouraging each of them that they can return to trust.

After trust is established, it is important to earn the respect of our horses. We kindly and firmly show that we are in charge, allowing the horse to choose to give us his respect. The horse may choose his own way, but he will quickly learn that this always result in more work. Once respect is given, the horse learns that the best place to be is listening to the trainer that he trusts.

Understanding is crucial in our training because hundreds of precious children will be learning life lessons from them during this next season. Our ultimate goal is to have sensitive horses that will understand the slightest pressures from the little legs and hands that will soon be guiding them.

We as a staff have learned so many lessons while in the round pen. Just like we invite our horses to trust and submit, it is clear that God also waits for us to trust and submit. It is all too easy to frantically run in circles, ignoring His gentle whispers that call us to His side. But faithfully, patiently He waits, whispering "Trust me, child." We can find rest when we choose to stop running and turn and face our Lord.

Our horses, with the majority of them coming from backgrounds of abuse and neglect, are the very core of what we do here at Crystal Peaks. These equines, once broken, lost and hurting, are now daily embraced by children who themselves have been through many similar circumstances. For the many horses who call this place home, Crystal Peaks offers a safe haven, a gentle hand and a life purpose. Our training and riding methods are based on the theories of natural horsemanship. This method utilizes quiet patience to communicate with horses in their own language. It is our highest goal to develop a trust relationship with each of these magnificent creatures.
